

Assistant Professor of Business

The College of Idaho invites applications for a tenure-track position in the Business & Accounting Department to start in Fall 2025. We seek candidates whose teaching, research, and service will contribute to our <u>commitment</u> to an equitable and inclusive learning and work environment.

The College currently offers undergraduate majors in business administration, marketing & digital media, and accounting. We seek generalists with experience in teaching and research/scholarship who can fill <u>some</u> of the following teaching areas, listed in order of departmental need: Introduction to Business, Management (various courses including Production & Operations Management, Organizational Behavior), Marketing (various courses), Sport Administration, and Leadership. In your application letter, please identify the teaching areas that pertain to your education, experiences, and interests.

The normal annual teaching load is 21 credits distributed between Fall and Spring semesters and a 1-month January term. Additional duties include academic advising, scholarship and service to the College and department. Professional development support for research, conference travel, and sabbatical leave are available. The Department's student-centered approach emphasizes the intersection of theory and practice and prepares graduates for productive careers.

Excellent teaching and mentoring of students are the highest priorities of the College. Qualifications

At least four (4) months of college-level teaching experience required. Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from the College.
